International Conference

Since the 1990s, global history and its two adjacent historiographical approaches (entangled and connected history) have made crucial contributions to contemporary historiography: they have questioned Western-centred and nation-centred visions, and have put emphasis on the links tying different geographical and cultural areas together.

This international conference is fully aligned with the above-mentioned premises. However, it also aims to give attention to certain dimensions (i.e., the political one) and geographical areas (Latin America, Southern Europe) that global history has tended to overlook. Indeed, the aim of this conference is to identify and analyse the political and cultural links connecting Southern Europe to Latin America in the 20th century, as well as the circulation of agency, ideas and practices between these two regions.

Despite of our focus on politics, we argue for an approach to political history which integrates the contributions of cultural and social history. Moreover, regarding the transnational agency, we pay special attention not only to international organizations (i.e., the United Nations) but also to nation-states and non-institutionalised agency (militancy, clandestine networks, intellectuals, scientists). Furthermore, we address 20th-century Latin American and Southern European political history not only through an entangled approach, but also through a parallel and cross-analysis of the circulation of right-wing, centre and left-wing agency and ideologies. This comparative and, at the same time, cross-cutting approach does not seek to deny the profound differences that separate the aforementioned political sensibilities. Instead, it aims to uncover unknown geographical and political positive or negative interactions, which will remain hidden as long as we classify and isolate historical actors depending on their official functions or ideological stances.
